Dr Stephen Lee received the 2021 AIA – Jim McColl Young Consultant Award. Stephen is based at Roseworthy Campus where he is the Partnerships Manager for the Davies Livestock Research Centre, School of Animal & Veterinary Sciences at the University of Adelaide.

From 2015 to 2019 Stephen was at the Manager of the SA Sheep Industry and Beef Industry Blueprints. As Blueprint Manager he helped develop and implement many collaborative projects across the red meat and wool value chain aimed at increasing productivity, sustainability and whole of value chain revenue.

Stephen has also undertaken applied research and development with industry partners in areas spanning genetic improvement, enhancing meat quality, reducing greenhouse gas emissions and improving maternal productivity and weaner performance.
